The birds were liberated at 0600hrs in a south west wind that was fresh on route, the winners made light work of the distance and arrived in 5 hrs 34 minutes recording a velocity of 1832 y/m.

Again back at the top was the phenomenal partnership of **GWP Macaloney** who had four pigeons drop together to win the first four positions in the Open with 928 birds competing. To date this is the premier race of the season.

As I have reported on many a time Paul & Wullie are magicians of their trade. For us" mere mortals" you can only shake your head how good these guys are! You try every week but there isn't anyone who can touch them for consistency and team performances. To get four in the drop from 350 miles is remarkable.
